Yesterday, the world celebrated "White Cane Day".

Therefore, I thought it an opportune moment to share with you a little story I read about a remarkable lady who was not only blind, but deaf as well.

It was a cold winter afternoon in 1920. A large number of people were waiting outside an exhibition hall in the city of New York to purchase tickets. Inside the hall, the manager seemed to be highly pleased. A large number of people had arrived, many more than his expectations. A new kind of exhibition was being presented on that day.

The curtain went up. The stage was set up like a reception room in a house. A young man who sat beside a piano rose and bowed ceremoniously. He introduced a majestic middle-aged woman to the audience. It was Anne Sullivan Macy. Anne made a brief speech. Everyone listened attentively to her sweet-sounding words. Later another woman, beautifully dressed and pleasant-looking, walked on to stage. Anne clasped her hand.

She just looked at the audience and stood revealed. Later, that woman - Helen Keller - spoke. She struggled hard to let out each word. The audience too struggled to grasp what she said. Still they kept their ears strained and sharp. A long applause resounded in the hall when Helen stopped speaking. Back in the day, these two were among the most famous people in America. Anne Sullivan was a bold educationist and civil rights spokesperson. Helen Adams Keller was her deaf and blind disciple. Despite being handicapped, she had made a name for herself as a writer, women's liberation activist

The audience was immensely touched by Helen's speech. Her words could be summed up this way: "My teacher told you how her one word touched the darkness of my mind and how I woke up to the bliss of life. I was dumb; now I can speak. I am obliged to the hands and hearts of others for this achievement. Through their love I came to see my mind; I could see God, I could find happiness. In fact, we all live for helping others and for being helped. By remaining united we can do a lot of things. Only love can break down the walls that stand between us and our happiness. The greatest commandment is to love one another. I would like to thank God at the top of my voice for all the love, happiness and hope that would be coming to me."

Why did Helen Keller give such a message? Both Helen and her teacher needed money to live. They got ready for this show in the hope of being paid. The audience had come to get a glance of this 'living miracle' much more than hearing a lecture. Most of them were curious as if they were viewing a rare creation. But Helen Keller's glory lies in the fact that she suffered all such humiliations and fought bravely for the rights of the physically handicapped people. She declared that the physically handicapped people had the right to live like normal people.

Let us do all we can to help those who are physically challenged to live just as we do.

TOLERANCE IS BASED ON HEALTHY SELF-ESTEEM

Feeling good about yourself and your background is not the same as feeling superior to others. (In fact, children with poor self-esteem are more likely to be intolerant. They put others down to feel better about themselves.)

HELP BUILD YOUR CHILD'S SELF-ESTEEM

by letting your child know that he or she:

- ★ is important and special
- ★ is respected as an individual
- ★ has talents and strengths
- has rights -- and responsibilities.

CELEBRATE YOUR FAMILY HERITAGE

- --for example:
- ★ Talk about your ancestors
- -- where they lived, the challenges they faced, etc.
- ★ Point out the influence of your heritage on family customs, special foods and holiday observances.
- ★ Read stories and folk tales from the land(s) of your ancestors.

Point out that other families also celebrate their heritage. Compare your traditions with some of theirs.

HELPING YOUR CHILD TO RECOGNISE WORDS Words in books

- ★ Point to a word. Ask your child to find the same word on a different page.
- ★ When reading books with repeating patterns, ask your child to point to the words as they read them. Pointing focuses on reading the words rather than just memorising the text.
- ★ Before reading a new book, ask your child to look through the first few pages and find words that he or she already knows. This can help a nervous child feel more confident about tackling something new.

Looking closely

- ★ Talk about the shape of different words: for example, 'a long word', 'a short word'.
- ★ Write words using different media (paint, felt pens, rainbow crayons).
- ★ Make words out of magnetic, foam or plastic letters.
- ★ Use the letters to make two words that are similar, such as 'the' and 'they'. Ask your child to say what is the same and what is different. Then ask the child to make 'the' into 'they' and 'they' into 'the'.
